 Develop clear and specific milestones for the coming months, outlining the conditions so communities and business operators have clear and transparent indicators to help with planning.





### Re-launch Tourism – TIABC Recommendations

- Intra-provincial travel (non-essential) restrictions
- Interprovincial travel (nonessential) restrictions
- International travel for vaccinated travelers
- Return to office and travel for government and corporations
- Pub/restaurant indoor dining reopening
- Pub/restaurant party size requirements
- Business Meetings size requirements (50, 100) distancing protocols
- Events & Festivals indoor vs outdoor
- Theatres & Live Music Venues
- In-Person Sporting Events
- Casinos





### Re-launch Tourism – TIABC Recommendations

Joint communications:

- Encouraging safe travel
- Positive messaging and optimism about traveling again
- Encouraging good behaviour and avoiding travel shaming
- Active support for government & corporate travel





## Liquidity – TIABC Recommendations

- Focussed on large operators
- Working capital grants
- Government-secured loans
- 60% of businesses not able to service debt

# Liquidity – TIABC Recommendations

 Government must implement easy to access financial relief, similar to the *Circuit Breaker* package offered to pubs, bars, restaurants and hotels affected by the March order

## Liquidity – TIABC Recommendations

Reduction, deferral or suspension of:

- Crown fees rod, water
- Lease payments
- Utility payments
- Employer Health Tax
- Property tax





## Re-opening Borders

- TIAC, TIABC, HAC, BCHA advocating to federal government re: border reopening criteria
- Digital vaccination cards likely to be developed by private sector
- Japan, China, Denmark issuing cards for citizens
- Countries may require proof of vaccination before opening borders





# Cruise – TIABC Recommendations

- The federal government reconsider its decision on cruise, especially if borders look to re-open in the fall
- The federal government reassess cruise every three months in the context of pandemic conditions, vaccinations, etc.





#### Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy – TIABC Recommendations

- The federal government extend the CEWS Business Support Program for tourism and hospitality businesses through mid-2022.
- The federal government maintain the 75% maximum level of the CEWS program for tourism and hospitality businesses through mid-2022.
- The federal government grant an exemption for tourism and hospitality businesses allowing them to claim under both the CEWS and CRHP programs.
